



Since 2017, Pierres et Fils has been bringing music to the streets with conviction, joy, and a carefree spirit. With an **original repertoire**, the nine musicians offer their own interpretation of the moment. A moment that might unfold in a public square, at a street corner, during a market, under a big top, or on a café terrace···

Over the past eight years, you may have come across the band during one of the **200 performances** they have already given in different regions of France and abroad (Aurillac Festival, Wuzhen Festival in China, Cirkul'art Festival in Slovakia, Monastier Festival, Les Fanfarfelues in Vitré, No Logo Festival, CNAREP Sur le Pont, Théâtre de Gascogne, Pilsen Busking Fest in the Czech Republic, Le Mans Sonore Festival, Baule d'Air Festival, La Luzège Festival, Futuroscope, Les Expressifs Festival, Ah, Humour et Création Festival in Villard-de-Lans...)







In this new show, the company Pierres & Fils offers an artistic **takeover of a space**, guided by the freedom of the 9 troubadours who make it up. They play with the spontaneity of the moment and aims to engrave some lovely memories in the eyes and ears of both young and old.

Pierres & Fils nurtures a genuine interest in **pedagogy**. Through cultural outreach, the group aims to highlight the values of its artistic and human project: advocating for **Art that is accessible to everyone**.

Participants in the various outreach projects are placed at the very heart of the performance — they play throughout the show and thus become active contributors to the artistic project.

Each outreach project is co-created between the local host organization and Pierres & Fils. This collaboration leads to a performance entitled "Bienvenue chez vous" (Welcome Home), culminating in a public presentation that can take on different forms. The goal of this exchange is clear: to learn music and staging together in order to create a vibrant blend between local identity and the band's playful, offbeat energy.

CECILE HESSE - Saxophone

Cécile, often called Cilou, began her musical journey on her older brother's plastic recorder. At the age of 7, she finally launched her own radio show using a cassette player/recorder from the early 2000s. She co-hosted it with her cousin, but Cilou mainly took charge of the musical segments: performing experimental piano recitals, two-string guitar solos, and singing songs whose lyrics remain mysterious to this day — even to her.



MANON MONTFORT - Trumpet

Manon, a trumpet player passionate about both classical and contemporary music, began her journey in Saint-Nazaire, by the sea, and now lives in Tours, at the heart of new inspirations. Between concerts, she dances hip-hop and never forgets that celebration and collective energy are integral parts of music.



THOMAS FOSSAERT - Soprano sax

I started music at the age of 2 with a plastic saxophone that made bubbles. Much later, I realized how limited the sounds it produced were, so I learned musical notes in the caves of my homeland, Périgord. Then I discovered that the rest of the world existed and let myself be swept away into a journey of sound and imagination.



HIPPOLYTE RENAUD - Trumpet



As a final nod to his first passion, Pierre now appears on stage in the most feline of colors: pink.



VALENTIN LAMBERT - Alto sax

Endless years of study have made him a saxophone specialist, and years of joy have turned him into a passionate multi-instrumentalist who teaches others.
